Elections for the Board

As was announced during the General Assembly of our fourteenth annual conference in Alcalá de Henares last November, it is our pleasure to inform you that our Board currently has three vacancies to fill. Therefore we would like to invite anyone who is interested in joining our Board to send in their applications for these positions.

As predefined in the bylaws, the application will be open for one month after the announcement of the elections (i.e. 9 November 2018), with no possibility of extension. Board members are elected for terms of four years. Current members of the Board can be nominated for a second term with the support of a current member of the Society. Board members will not seek election for a third term, but can be re-elected after a break.

To be eligible for Board membership, candidates should be members of the Society in good standing. This means that they have paid their membership dues for 2017 or later. In principle, it is possible to become a member in the month leading up to the election, but for bylaw compliance proof of payment should be provided ahead of time. Candidates also need the support of at least one member of the Society to qualify for elections.

To be considered, candidates should send their **letter of application**, alongside an up-to-date **CV** to the Society's secretary Wout Dillen (wout.dillen@uantwerpen.be). All self-nominations must be supported by at least one member of the Society.
