Elections Editor and Associate Editor of Variants

Owing to the transition of *Variants* to Open Access, the Board exceptionally extended the normal three-year term for the current Editor and Associate Editor of the journal. We are now seeking nominations for their replacement.

According to the bylaws, the process for election follows the same procedure as to the elections for the Board. All current members of the Society in good standing may nominate themselves for the position of General Editor or Associate Editor. This means that they have paid their membership dues for 2017 or later. In principle, it is possible to become a member in the month leading up to the election, but for bylaw compliance proof of payment should be provided ahead of time. Candidates also need the support of at least one member of the Society to qualify for elections. The application will be open for one month after the announcement of the elections (i.e. 9 November 2018), with no possibility of extension.

To be considered for the Editorship or Associate Editorship, candidates should send their **letter of application**, setting out her/his vision for the role, alongside an up-to-date **CV** to the Society's secretary Wout Dillen (wout.dillen@uantwerpen.be). The application must include evidence of **all of the following**:

- Excellent command of written English
- Expertise in the use of In-Design (or an equivalent DTP software application)
- Ability to use CMS for the preparation and management of the online version of the journal
